Haridwar's name is an amalgamation of two words, **Hari** (meaning God) and **Dwar** (Gate), literally meaning the Gateway to Heaven. is one of the first towns where the

Ganges river emerges from the mountains and meets the plains. Experience Ganga Aarti at **Har ki Pauri**, where a large number of people gather in the evenings on both banks of the river Ganga to sing its praises.
